

2016 highlights

In 2016, you helped us:

- Serve almost 31,000 meals to the hungry
- Provide nearly 10,500 nights of shelter to homeless men
- Support 15 men through our long-term LifeChange Discipleship Program
- Lead 39 men through the Transitional Employment Program, which provides shelter to men who are employed but struggling with homelessness

hen Pastor Montel Wilder encourages his congregation to serve at the Mission, he's not asking for anything he doesn't do himself.

The pastor of Grace Baptist Church in Pepperell, MA has been part of our "village" here for many years, teaching men like Frank as part of the LifeChange

Program and encouraging our volunteers as they serve in what can be a challenging field.

"I'm a pastor," he says to our team, "but here, you're on the front lines. You have an opportunity to reach the community with the gospel. You can reach people that I cannot, and it's an exciting thing!

"No matter who you are, there's some way you can

help out. This is a good organization, and when you volunteer, you'll walk away enriched because you've been able to put your faith in action."

If you, your church group or coworkers would like to be a part of the "village" that makes a difference at the Mission, consider taking on one of these volunteer positions:


- Food Pick Up Volunteers are needed to pick up fresh produce, bread and meat on Sunday mornings at the Hannafords in Hudson.

- Mentors and Prayer Warriors Walk alongside men in the LifeChange Program, and pray for our staff, volunteers, donors and guests.
- Social Enterprise Use your entrepreneurial spirit to help develop a small business that would employ Mission students while raising revenue to support the Mission.

Frank was out of options. After he lost his job, a series of painful injuries prevented him from finding another one. Eventually, he had no choice but to move into a tent.

The weather was freezing, though, so Frank did his best to keep warm. "I put pallets under the tent to keep it flat," he says, "and I put carpets on top of the pallets.



How caring people led Frank to new life

I had five comforters too, so even though it was cold, the covers made it ok."

Fortunately, Frank heard about the Mission from someone at the clinic where he was receiving medical care. He made his way here, grateful to find a place that would encourage him in his faith.

"I've been a Christian for a long time," Frank shares.
"I'm happy to be here because this is a place that loves
Jesus. The Bible studies have helped me grow closer to
God. I like going to Montel's classes.* We're studying the
book of John, and it helps me to not worry about things."

Frank is working through our LifeChange Discipleship Program and trying to figure out his next

steps. In the meantime though, he's grateful to have found support and compassion from so many different people at the Mission.

"Shawn is a great cook! He helps people who need meals but don't have enough money. It gives them a place to come eat, and it gives us an opportunity to tell them about Jesus.

"I'm just glad that God is taking care of me and that I have the opportunity to be close to Him. I'm really benefitting from this place, and I know a lot of other people are also. It's really a good place!"


Bring items to the Mission before Easter, Monday–Saturday 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. Most-needed items include:
