You Lifted Robert from His Lowest to His Happiest

A successful business owner, married for 27 years, Robert never thought he would end up in a rescue mission. However, 17 surgeries over the past ten years left him addicted to painkillers. "That put a huge strain on my marriage, and everything fell apart," he says. "I was the lowest I've ever been."

Homeless, alone and deeply depressed, Robert made his way to Southern New Hampshire Rescue Mission. What he found here, he says, was nothing short of a miracle.

"I was in a bad state when I came. I was devastated," Robert tells us. After joining the R12 LifeChange program, he says, "I got my confidence back. There are 12 guys in the program right now, and we all help one another. We push each other to be better — to hold ourselves to a higher standard. It has changed my life."

Robert experienced the love of Christ at the Mission and reconciled himself to God. "I knew about God, but I didn't *know* Him. He wasn't in my life the way He is now. He was always there, but I didn't let Him in. God is number one in my life now."

Looking ahead, Robert plans to study theology and become a pastor. While he attends school, he wants to continue helping out at the Mission and ministering to hurting people in Nashua. "I love being able to connect



and share the Word of God with them," he says.

Robert greatly appreciates your support. "Being in the program, I see firsthand what giving does," he says. "If you can change one person, and give them a little bit of hope each day, you're doing God's will.

"I'm happier now than I've ever been. I've found peace and love in my life that I've never had. God is shining His love on this place!"

Gift Center Provides Daily Bread and Much More

You may not know that while the Southern New Hampshire Rescue Mission operates as a men's homeless shelter, we do much more. We serve the entire community of Southern New Hampshire with food, clothing and of course, the love of Jesus Christ through our Gift Center.

The Gift Center is open every other Tuesday by appointment. Many in our community rely on us for groceries and clothing to relieve the stress of meeting simple daily needs. We receive supplies from the NH Food Bank and NH Fresh Rescue, as well as abundant donations from others who simply care and want to share what God has given them.

In the 3rd quarter alone, we provided enough groceries for over 8,700 meals. We met the needs of approximately 970 men, women and children. More than 150 individuals or families came to us for the first time.

This Thanksgiving, we provided turkeys and all the fixings to anyone who wished to cook a traditional Thanksgiving dinner. Just as "Every good gift and every perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of lights" (James 1:17), God uses many of us as His gift givers.
